Douglass Center for Basque Studies</b> The Center for Basque Studies (CBS) furthers Basque-related study by conducting, facilitating, and disseminating original Basque-related research in the humanities and social sciences, in cooperation with appropriate academic departments at the University of Nevada, Reno, as well as at other American and foreign universities.</p> <p>The primary mission of the Center is to conduct research on the Basques and to disseminate the results of interdisciplinary research on the Basques to a local, national and international audience through publications (including those produced by the CBS Press), conference presentations, lectures for the general public and creative activities. Research and outreach have been the highest priorities of the center since its founding in 1967 as the "Basque Studies Program." Service constitutes an important mission in promoting knowledge about the Basques through a range of academic and non-academic initiatives in cooperation with other departments at the University of Nevada, Reno.</p>

Spectacular Lake Tahoe and the largest concentration of ski facilities in the world are all within a fifty-mile radius. Biking, camping, hunting, fishing and mountain climbing are all activities Reno residents and visitors enjoy.</p> <p>The Reno-Sparks area offers a wide range of accommodation options, from motels to apartments. The Basque Library can provide suggestions and contacts for accommodation during the intern's stay.</p> <p>Public transportation in the Reno area is provided by the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) of Washoe County, Nevada. RTC serves the citizens of Reno and Sparks along with unincorporated areas of Washoe County. The Reno-Tahoe International Airport is an important asset to the region, serving approximately 4 million passengers per year. It was founded in 1874 as the State University of Nevada in Elko, Nev., about 300 miles northeast of its present-day campus in Reno. In 1885, the legislature approved the move of the University from Elko to Reno.</p> <p>Colleges and schools: Agriculture, Biotechnology and Natural Resources; Business; Education; Engineering; Journalism; Liberal Arts; Medicine; Graduate School; and the Division of Health Sciences.</p> <p>The William A. Douglass Center for Basque Studies is part of the College of Liberal Arts, sharing the space with the Jon Bilbao Basque Library.</p>
