# BEFORE ARRIVING TO MEXICO

## -APPLY FOR YOUR EXCHANGE

- Make sure that your university has a student exchange agreement with Universidad Internacional and that sends via e-mail the following documents to the internationalization department:
  - Exchange request
  - Subject equivalence
  - Motivation letter
  - Copy of passport
  - Digital photo
- Universidad Internacional will issue an acceptance letter, and will send it to the International Relations Department from your University.

- 3. Lookup the web page of the Mexican embassy (or consulate) in order to check if you need a student visa and the procedure to obtain it if necessary.
- 4. Once you are selected, you will have to send the following documents via e-mail:
  - Copy of the International Medical Insurance
  - If applicable: Copy of your student visa
  - Flight plan

## -TRAVELLING / MIGRATION

- ✓ Look up the requirements of your country to travel to Mexico.
- ✓ Look up the list of objects that you cannot take on board for security reasons, such as sharp items, weapons and scissors among others. Also, check your luggage's weight and the number of luggage allowed.
- Get a good night's sleep before your trip and wear comfortable clothes.
- ✓ Drink as much water as you can to stay hydrated, stretch whenever you can and walk during your flight.
- We recommend arriving to Cuernavaca a week before the semester start so you can begin to look for a suitable accommodation.
- ✓ You can change your money to Mexican pesos in the airport without commissions. In this case, be discreet; remember that a tourists attracts the attention. If you arrive too early or too late to Mexico, we recommend you to change your money before travelling.

- ✓ Do not forget to change your clock to the standard hour. UTC/GMT -6.
- ✓ If applicable: Once you have arrived to Mexico, you will need to exchange your 30-day tourist visa for a student permit. For this, you will need to go to the National Migration Office located in Cuernavaca; the address is Av. Vicente Guerrero No. 107 Col. Lomas de Cortés, Cuernavaca, Morelos. The Internationalization Department will help you in this step.
- ✓ Consider a difference in power outlets, in case you are planning to bring electrical devices, (110v) and get a voltage converter if needed.
  - ✓ Do not forget to always carry a copy of your passport and cash with you.

## - ARRIVING TO MEXICO

Once in the –Mexico City Airport, go to the bus stop at the end of the fast food area, and buy a ticket in Pullman de Morelos to take the bus that goes straight to Cuernavaca (Casino de la Selva).

> The departure schedule is from 06:30 to 00:30 every 40min and the price is around 300\$ MXN.

You could also arrange to have someone from UNINTER pick you up from the airport. Prices vary depending on the number of people

- 1 person 100\$ USD
- 2 3 people 110\$ USD
- 4-6 people 140\$ USD

Once you get to Cuemavaca you arrive to Cuemavaca, you will have to take a cab directly to your destination. Keep in mind that you have to ask for the fare before getting in, prices in Cuemavaca are negotiable. The cab should charge you no more than \$60 MXN to get to your destination; however, if it is raining or it is late night, the fare may increase.


Once you get to your hostel or hotel, it is important that you get to the Internationalization Department for orientation in the accommodation, the arrangement of your schedule and processing your student ID

## -ACCOMODATION

#### What housing options do I have?

We strongly recommend that you begin searching accommodation after arriving to Cuernavaca rather than from your home country. By doing so you will be able to choose what best suits your needs. We offer following options:

Apartments, bungalows and houses: UNINTER will provide you a list of apartments or rooms that count with kitchen, living room, dining room and bathrooms. You will have to sign a contract and pay one month's worth of deposit.

Within this plan you have the following options:

- a) Single or Double room: bathroom and weekly cleaning service and no meals. The minimum stay is one semester.
- b) Single or Double room: bathroom, weekly cleaning service and two meals (5 days a week).
- c) Apartment, house or bungalow: two-three rooms, bathroom(s), living room, dining room and kitchen.

If you need the directory, the Internationalization Department will request the housing list to the Foreigner Student Attention Department

**NOTE:** Sheets, Pillows and Comforters are generally not included when renting a place. We recommend you to bring your own bedding. Page 19 will give you references of where to go in terms of buying your own bedding.

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## - **EVALUATION SYSTEM**

UNINTER is registered in the Ministry of Public Education known in Spanish as SEP and works under the credit system: 1 credit for each 15-20 hours in class with a grading system from 1-10.

On the first day of class, the teacher will hand you a syllabus with an outline of the themes you will see over the course of the semester.

Likewise, your teacher will inform you of the evaluation system that will determine your grades.

During your semester at UNINTER, you will take three partial exams (one per month) and one final exam.

# LIFE IN CUERNAVACA



## -CULTURE

Mexico is a country with a rich cultural diversity full of traditions and customs, which you should take into account if you want to live in Mexico for a while. Always remember: "When in Rome do as the Romans"

- Mexicans have the habit of greeting someone by shaking hands. When greeting a woman, they use to give her a small kiss on the cheek, when greeting a man, they just high-five each other
- ❖ Mexicans are used to bathe daily (even more than once); they always have clean hands, they mainly wash them before and after eating and after using the bathroom; they also use deodorant and perfume to always smell good because for them, it is part of their appearance.
- Mexicans are very good at preparing and serving appetizing meals. Some of the most delicious foods are tacos, tortas, tamales, atole, pozole, enchiladas, pambazos, sopes, mole, and nopales. Do not hesitate to try them all but take your precautions as some of them can be heavy on your stomach, especially if you are not accustomed to the Mexican cuisine.
- Mexicans tend to eat a lot of spicy food, and they put hot sauce or simply spicy pepper on almost every meal. If you are not used to eating spicy food, it's better to start with small portions.
- Mexicans are very funny and can be considered jokesters. They joke around all the time, no matter the situation or the moment, so please do not be shocked if you are joked with.
- Mexicans are a bit unpunctual. They tend to arrive 5 to 15 minutes later to the arranged appointment; therefore, you will have to wait a little.
- Mexico is always partying; Mexicans have many different religious traditions with parties throughout various regions of the country. Do not hesitate in assisting any carnival or fair, it will be an unforgivable moment full of culture and flavors.



## -SHOPPING CENTERS

The city of Cuernavaca has various options for your shopping. Downtown is where you can find most of the markets and shops with very reasonable prices according to your needs, as well as restaurants and pubs.

In case that you want to find everything at one place, comfortably, a good environment and well-known brands, you can try Galerías Cuemavaca, Plaza Cuemavaca and Plaza Veranda

If you want to prepare your own food, there is a wide variety of supermarkets like Walmart, Costco, Chedraui, Superama (more expensive, but has import goods), Comercial Mexicana, SAMS and Soriana.

\*NOTE: You need a membership to shop at SAMS and Costco. You can get it inside the mall at a price of around 500 pesos.


