<b>INFORMATION ABOUT THE CITY AND THE AREA WHERE THE COMPANY/INSTITUTION IS LOCATED</b> (General information about SECURITY, ACCOMODATION, PUBLIC TRANSPORT...)	<p>Ormston House is located in the heart of Limerick City and on the edge of a key zone for regeneration under the Limerick 2030 economic and spatial plan. The city centre was awarded the Purple Flag last year for providing a vibrant and diverse mix of dining, entertainment and culture while promoting safety and well-being of visitors and local residents. The average monthly rent for a room in shared accommodation is €350. Ormston House will assist the trainee with temporary accommodation on arrival (up to two weeks) and support with finding suitable accommodation for the duration of the internship. The city centre is manageable on foot however there is also a public bicycle scheme, a regular bus service, an intercity train service, and an international airport 20 minutes from the city.</p>
<b>GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE COMPANY/INSTITUTION</b>	<p>Ormston House is a company limited by guarantee governed by a Board of Directors. The programmes are run by students and recent graduates of Limerick School of Art and Design.</p>

<b>MAIN ACTIVITY OF THE COMPANY/INSTITUTION</b>	<p>Ormston House is a meeting place for the arts in the heart of Limerick City. We opened in 2011 as a Cultural Resource Centre to welcome audiences seeking more maverick and experimental projects. As an agile organisation with an alternative ethos, Ormston House offers an intimate experience with direct access to and interaction between artists, participants and staff. The three pillars of our programme are artistic ambition, professional development and public/community engagement. Our core question is: <i>How can we support artists better?</i></p> <p>Ormston House is a member of the <i>Artists' Initiatives Meetings</i> with 10 European partners and of the <i>River Cities Network</i> with 22 European partners.</p>
<b>A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF MAIN PROJECTS</b>	<p>We are currently running four multi-year projects with focused research opportunities: 1) feminist economies, 2) river engineering and ecological challenges, 3) intercultural dialogue and social cohesion, and 4) sustainable artistic practices. Ormston House also hosts ten festivals specialising in a range of art-forms and disciplines including architecture, film, food, literature, music, politics, and visual arts. Ormston House is also focusing on internationalisation and mobility to expand international networks for training and exchange opportunities.</p>

<p><b>PREVIOUS COLLABORATION IN INTERNSHIP/TRAINING PROGRAMMES?</b></p>	<p>Ormston House has hosted four trainees through the Global Training Scheme and two self-funded international trainees. We have also partnered with Limerick School of Art and Design on a Professional Practice module, and with the University of Limerick to support the new MA/MSc. in Art and Technology. Co-Director Mary Conlon has also presented at the University of the Basque Country and the University of Lithuania through Erasmus+.</p>
