We are pleased to inform you that more than a hundred proposals for symposiums, communications and posters have been received.

We continue to work towards offering the congress in hybrid form, i.e. presential and live online. In line with this plan, we have adapted the outline of the attached provisional programme.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Registration deadline:

For those making a submission, there will be a single deadline: from 29 March to 31 May.

The deadline for registration as a listener will be open until the day of the congress.

The possibility of registering in the face-to-face modality will depend on the conditions of the pandemic and the capacity in force at any given time.

Who has to register:

All admitted authors (symposium, paper, poster...) must register and pay the conference registration fee. Although it appears in the abstracts, the names of authors who do not pay the registration fee will not appear in the programme nor will they be given any document.

Those who have submitted more than one communication must register and pay the registration fee only once.

What they will receive in return for registering:

Those who pay the registration fee will receive the following:

- Online or in-person participation in the congress.
- Access to live online communications.
- Access to pre-recorded lectures and video posters.
- The possibility of having your name on the congress programme.
- Access to the collection of abstracts.
- Certificate of having presented the work at the congress.
- For those who attended as listeners, a certificate of attendance at the congress.

Registration fees:

There will only be two types of registration, and it will be the same for presenters and listeners:

- Normal registration fee: 100 euros.
- Reduced registration fee for students and unemployed: 50 euros.

In the case of reduced registration, a document proving this must be presented.

Those who will participate in person will also be asked when registering whether they will take part in the social programme.

How will registration and tuition fees be paid?

The user must register on the Summer Courses platform in order to start the process.

Social programme

Organised social programming will be carried out according to the evolution of the pandemic. These are the activities planned:

• Guided visit to *Chillidaleku* (https://www.museochillidaleku.com/en/) and afterwards, a dinner in a *sagardotegi* (traditional menu). The bus is included.

Anyone wishing to take part must register and pay at the same time as registering for the congress.

In case that the pandemic situation makes it impossible to carry out the face-to-face activities, the full amount of the social programme will be refunded to all those who have made the payment.

The social programme will have a single price: 85 euros.

Registration form:

All authors making a presentation at the Congress must fill in the form that appears in the following link: https://forms.gle/KHiMD1ibqQKp2bPF8

The following information must be provided on the registration form:

- Author's names.
- Surname(s) of the autor(s)
- Full name of the institution (not only abbreviations)
- E-mail address.
- Title of communication, symposium section or poster/short recording.
- Modality chosen to present the communication: face-to-face online live online pre-recorded poster/short recording.
- Language of the communication.

People attending as listeners do not have to fill in the form.

TYPES OF COMMUNICATIONS TO BE PRESENTED

Symposium format:

Symposiums are coordinated communication sessions that include three presentations and a discussion. They have a coordinator who will be in charge of the internal organization of the symposium.

Following the format assigned in the programme, each symposium will be devoted to a two-hour slot, including a discussion.

Communication format:

Presentations can be face-to-face, live online or pre-recorded. In all cases, authors will have 20 minutes to make the presentation, and 10 minutes will be saved for the debate.

Those who send the 20-minute pre-recorded presentation will be able to participate in the discussion afterwards.

Regardless of the mode of presentation, all papers will be presented in the allocated time slot.

Poster and short recording format:

All presentations in this section will be online and asynchronous, i.e. the presentation videos must be submitted pre-recorded.

Those who in the abstract selection process have been assigned a poster presentation (poster / short recording), should submit a 10-minute recording in which they present their research.

Recordings longer than 10 minutes will not be accepted.

The recording will consist of the following parts:

- Introduction
- Explanation of the theoretical framework
- Methodology
- Results
- Conclusions/Discussion

The date and form in which these recordings will be made available will be determined in the final programme.

SUMMARY: DATES AND INFORMATION TO BE TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT

Registration period for those who have presented a paper: from 29 March to 31 May.

- Deadline to register as a listener: until the day of the congress.
- Deadline for sending pre-recorded videos: until 15 June.
- Video-recording format: MP4 or MOV.
