## CHECK TIMETABLES OF SUBJECTS

To be able to check the timetables of subjects it is necessary to know the degree and year each course corresponds to.

## To see the schedule

- Enter <u>https://hektor.webuntis.com/WebUntis/?school=EHU#/basic/main</u>. You do not need to enter any username or password. Just click on the calendar ("Horarios", it means, schedules) on the left of the page).
- 2. In the next window, you will see three columns. Go to the one in the centre ("Sección") and choose *Escuela Ingeniería de Bilbao*.
- 3. Now, go to the column on the left ("Grupos") and choose the degree and group you are interested in. For example, for Digital Systems, which is taught in the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the Bachelor degree in Telecommunications Engineering, you should look for **306-3º-61-Grado en Ing. en Tec. de Telecom.** *Inglés.*
- 4. Choose the week on the column on the right, to see the schedules of theory and practice classes of that subject. You should do it for every week, in order to ensure there are no overlaps with the other courses you attend.

## Keep in mind that...

- There may be several groups with different schedules, depending on the degree and the year,. For example:
  - Groups in Spanish: 01, 02, 03 (morning); 16, 17 (afternoon)
  - Groups in Basque: 31, 32 (morning); 46 (afternoon)
  - Groups in English: 61, 66 (morning)
  - Groups in French: 81

Example: 306-3º-61-Grado en Ing. en Tec. de Telecom. Inglés.

There are different **types of class** (not all subjects have all types):

- **Magistral** (master class): in the classroom (theory, problems), they are the same every week of the term or semester. You can see where the classroom is. If **"Teoría**" or **PA1** appears, it is the same.
- **Laboratorios** (labs) (GL1, GL2, GL3 ... or PL1, PL2, PL3...). The theory group is divided into subgroups for the lab. Each student should be in ONLY ONE of these subgroups and can choose the one that best fits his/her schedule.
- Laboratories are not taught every week.
