

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CALL FOR THE INTERNATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM OF THE TRANSOCEANIC CAMPUS (ITP-TOC 2026)

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Features Overview

The Call for Applications to the **International Training Program of the Transoceanic Campus (ITP-TOC 2026)** aims to promote the international **mobility of students enrolled at the Boise State University by supporting international internships in the Basque Country (Spain) to carry out activities and projects.** The organizing entity will be the University of the Basque Country / Euskal Herriko Unibertsitatea) (EHU), and the internships will be carried out at a collaborating entity based in the Basque Country (companies, research centers, social or cultural entities, or organizational units within the EHU itself).

Applicant profile: undergraduate and postgraduate students enrolled at BSU – all majors
Eligible term: 2025-26 academic year

Publication of results: May 8, 2026
Training period: 2 months - From June 1 to July 31, 2026
Location: Basque Country – Spain (Host university EHU + Host organization). The university of the Basque Country has 3 campus: Leioa (Bilbao), San Sebastian and Vitoria
Scholarship allowance: Covering the following costs: International travel costs, insurance, living and accommodation expenses, and mandatory administrative costs. Living expenses will be 800€ per month (~950 USA\$).

I. PURPOSE OF THE CALL

1. This Call is published in the framework of the Trans-oceanic Campus agreement signed between EHU (University of the Basque Country / Euskal Herriko Unibertsitatea) and BSU (Boise State University) in 2025. The Trans-oceanic campus project seeks acting as a platform for academic, scientific, and cultural collaboration between both universities and their respective regions. It aims at promoting the exchange of knowledge, fostering alliances between research groups, and facilitating teaching practices in support of multilingual education, pedagogical innovation, and student mobility between both universities.
 2. This Call for Applications is issued by EHU in the exercise of its powers in the field of international mobility and regulates the award of **International Training Scholarships** for the **2025-2026 academic year** to students enrolled in BSU.
 3. The ***International Training Program of the Transoceanic Campus (ITP-TOC 2026)*** aims to promote the transnational mobility of EHU and BSU students to carry out activities and projects by supporting **international internships with a predefined practical training plan**, aligned with the academic and professional profile of each participant.
 4. A total of **ten (10) scholarships** will be awarded under this Call to students enrolled in Boise State University (USA) to undertake internships in **companies or entities located in the Basque Country (Spain)**.
 5. The implementation of this Call is subject to the availability of sufficient budgetary resources and shall be governed by the principles of **publicity, transparency, competition, objectivity, equality, and non-discrimination**, in accordance with Spanish and Basque public funding regulations.
 6. The scholarships will be awarded to applicants in accordance with the selection process set out in this Terms and Conditions of this call, until the number of scholarships available has been filled.
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II. SCHOLARSHIPS CONTENT, AND DURATION

1. The scholarships awarded shall include a **two-month full-time international internship**, to be carried out in a collaborating company or host organization of the Basque Country, between **1 June 2026 and 31 July 2026**.

During the internship, scholarship recipients will perform their duties in person, as required, and must be accompanied at all times by company staff and assigned mentor from its host university.

2. Internships shall be governed by a **Training Agreement** (Annex II), defining tasks, objectives, supervision, and duration.
3. Scholarship status shall be acquired upon issuance of the **scholarship award decision** by the organizing entity.

II. NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS, BENEFITS, AND FINANCIAL LIMITS

1. A maximum of **ten (10) scholarships** shall be awarded.
 2. The scholarship includes the following benefits :
 - a) A **financial allowance** intended to contribute to:
 - ⇒ International travel costs
 - ⇒ Living and accommodation expenses
 - b) **Insurance coverage** for the entire duration of the scholarship, including:
 - ⇒ Accident and illness insurance
 - ⇒ Civil liability insurance covering damage to third parties
 - ⇒ Repatriation and travel assistance
 3. The total gross amount of the scholarship and the payment schedule shall be specified in the Scholarship Award Decision and shall be subject to applicable tax and social security deductions, in accordance with current legislation.
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IV. REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS

1. Applicants must meet and prove compliance with the following requirements at the time of application:
 - a) Be enrolled in, or have completed within the last academic year, an official university undergraduate degree or postgraduate degree in Boise State University (USA).
 - b) Be under 35 years of age on 1 January 2026.
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V. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. The University of the Basque Country (EHU) will make available to BSU students a set of destinations for internships, with their corresponding specific requirements regarding prior training and language knowledge requirements (if applicable).
 2. Applications must be submitted within the period from **April 13 to May 1, 2026**, inclusive.
 3. All the required documentation (see annex III) must be submitted signed in pdf format by email to transferentzia-nazioarte.eo@ehu.eus
 4. It must be indicated in the subject of the email "Call for Applications to the ITP-TOC 2026"
 5. Submission of an application implies full acceptance of these Terms and Conditions.
 6. Each applicant may submit **only one application** under this Call.
 7. If documentation is incomplete or defective, applicants will be granted a **5 working-day correction period**. Failure to remedy deficiencies will result in exclusion.
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VI. SELECTION PROCEDURE

1. The selection procedure shall be conducted by a **Selection Committee**, composed of at least two representatives appointed by EHU.

2. Selection shall be based on the principles of equality, merit, and ability, and shall include:
 - a) Evaluation of the **Curriculum Vitae** and academic background.
 - b) Assessment of complementary training and professional or internship experience.
 3. Following the evaluation, a list of selected candidates shall be published **by May 8, 2026**
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VII. SCHOLARSHIP AWARD DECISION

1. The University (EHU) shall issue a **Scholarship Award Decision**, specifying:
 - ⇒ Beneficiary identity
 - ⇒ EHU mentor and title of the project
 - ⇒ Company or organization where the internship will take place (from the proposed list)
 - ⇒ Dates and duration of the internship,
 - ⇒ Financial allocation
 - ⇒ Internship tasks and objectives
 2. Selected candidates must formally accept the scholarship by signing the **Acceptance Document (Annex I)** within 5 working days of notification. Failure to do so will be understood as a waiver.
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VIII. OBLIGATIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

Scholarship recipients are obliged to:

- a) Carry out the internship on a full-time and exclusive basis, with a **maximum of 40 hours per week**, and not engage in any other paid activity.

- b) Obtain all visas, permits, vaccinations, and authorizations required by the destination country.
 - c) Comply with the rules, schedules, and instructions of the host organization.
 - d) Respect confidentiality and intellectual property obligations established by the host external entity under their usual legal framework. This will be subject to specific processing with the entity.
 - e) Submit progress and final reports as required by the organizing entity (Annex IV).
 - f) Reimburse any unduly received amounts in case of loss of scholarship status.
 - g) Sign the Affidavit of Compliance and Compatibility (Annex V).
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IX. OBLIGATIONS OF THE ORGANIZING ENTITY

The university (EHU) shall:

- a) Coordinate placements and formalize agreements with host organizations.
 - b) Ensure insurance coverage.
 - c) Manage scholarship payments according to the following schedule:
 - ⇒ prior to the start of the internship
 - ⇒ at the midpoint of the internship
 - ⇒ upon completion and approval of final documentation
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X. LOSS OF SCHOLARSHIP STATUS

Scholarship status may be lost due to:

- a) Voluntary resignation.
- b) Failure to comply with obligations set out in this Call.
- c) Early termination of the internship attributable to the beneficiary.
- d) Occurrence of any circumstance foreseen in applicable subsidy regulations.

In such cases, proportional reimbursement of funds may be required.

XI. LEGAL REGIME AND APPEALS

This Call is governed by Spanish and Basque regulations applicable to public subsidies. Decisions may be subject to the corresponding administrative or legal appeals.
