

## University master's degrees with access requirements

### Academic year 2026/2027

In addition to access degrees, the following master's degrees have additional requirements:

<p><b>Actuarial and Financial Sciences</b></p>	<p>For students with certain Access degrees (Economics, Law, Statistics, Mathematics, Engineering, Architecture, Physics or other technical courses), completing complementary training may be required during the first course of the master's degree.</p> <p>Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.</p>

<p><b>Advanced Engineering Materials</b></p>	<p>Knowledge of at least a C1 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.</p> <p>Clarification of admission criteria regarding accredited Spanish language proficiency (C1):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>–Only accreditations issued by the Instituto Cervantes and its associated centres (DELE or SIELE containing a verification code or accreditations from recognised centres, provided they contain a reference to the successful completion of the four language skills) will be valid, as well as those issued by ACLES Associated Centres (<a href="https://acles.es/es/centros-asociados">https://acles.es/es/centros-asociados</a>) and specific tables for recognised Spanish levels included in <a href="https://acles.es/index.php/acreditaciones/216-tablas-decertificados-reconocidos-por-acles">https://acles.es/index.php/acreditaciones/216-tablas-decertificados-reconocidos-por-acles</a>.</li> <li>–Credentials that only refer to the completion and/or attendance of a course or that only contain the level and overall grade without reference to the achievement of the four language skills will never be accepted.</li> <li>–The Academic Committee of the Master's Degree may assess the level of Spanish through a personal interview in Spanish and a reference to the candidate's ability to correctly follow the activities of the Master's Degree.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Advanced Technologies in Industry</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of level C1 in Spanish for non-native speakers through official certificates or other merits that the academic committee considers sufficient to certify this level.</p>
<p><b>Auditing and Advanced Accounting</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of B2 in Spanish, by means of a certificate or by means that the Academic Commission considers appropriate, except for graduates of Spanish degrees in the Spanish University System or from a Spanish-speaking country.</p>
<p><b>Banking and Quantitative Finance</b></p>	<p>Applicants must have Spanish language training equivalent to level B2, accredited by the Instituto Cervantes with official certification, or be nationals of a country where Spanish is an official or co-official language. However, to verify this language requirement, the master's degree Academic Committee may invite any applicant to an interview, either in person or by videoconference, to assess their ability to follow the classes adequately.</p>
<p><b>Basque Linguistics and Philology</b></p>	<p>Certificate of level C1 in Basque or verification of the corresponding level through an interview.</p>

<b>Biomedical Engineering</b>	For foreign students, accreditation of knowledge of Spanish language.
<b>Biomedical Research</b>	Accreditation of level C1 in Spanish by certificate or personal interview.
<b>Business Management from an Innovation and Internationalization Perspective</b>	<p>For students with access degrees not related to the business economics field, the completion of additional training may be required.</p> <p>Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.</p>
<b>Ceramics: Art and Function</b>	<p>Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.</p>
<b>Chemical Engineering</b>	<p>Accreditation of a B2 level of Spanish is required, which can be demonstrated by an official certificate or other means deemed appropriate by the Academic Committee. This requirement does not apply to individuals who have completed undergraduate studies taught in Spanish within the Spanish university system or to people from Spanish-speaking countries.</p> <p>Students with certain access degrees may be required to complete complementary training, with the exception of Degree in Chemical Engineering, Degree in Industrial Chemical Engineering, Degree in Environmental Engineering by the UPV/EHU, Chemical Engineering, Industrial Technical Engineering (esp. Industrial Chemistry), Industrial Engineering (esp. Industrial Chemistry).</p>
<b>Chemistry and Polymers</b>	<p>Since three subjects are offered in English, the academic committee of the Master's Degree shall ensure that students who wish to enroll in some of them prove their language skills in that language. No specific level of English is expected to be required to all students, given that because they are all optional subjects, students who are not fluent in English can complete their academic journey in the Master's Degree avoiding the aforementioned subjects.</p>

<b>Cognitive Neuroscience of Language</b>	<p>English: Cambridge First Certificate or higher (or equivalent), or verified by personal interview.</p> <p>Basic knowledge of data analyses and experimental design.</p>
<b>Comparative Literature and Literary Studies</b>	<p>Provide proof of a C1 level of Spanish with an official certificate recognised by the CRUE. The Academic Committee will conduct a personal interview to verify the accredited level. Graduates of Spanish-taught university degrees in the Spanish university system or in a Spanish-speaking country will be exempt from this procedure.</p>
<b>Conservation and Exhibition of Contemporary Art (CYXAC)</b>	<p>Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. <b>Construction Engineering</b>	<p>Achieve a minimum score of 50 points out of 100 with the <u>merit assessment criteria</u> established by the master.</p> <p>For students from non-Spanish-speaking countries, accreditation of level C1 in Spanish.</p> <p>Clarification of admission criteria regarding accredited Spanish language level (B2):</p> <p>–Only accreditations issued by the Instituto Cervantes and its associated centres (DELE or SIELE containing a verification code or accreditations from recognised centres, provided they contain a reference to the successful completion of the four language skills) will be valid, as well as those issued by ACLES Associated Centres (<a href="https://acles.es/es/centros-">https://acles.es/es/centros-</a></p>

<p><b>Contemporary History</b></p>	<p>For foreign students, accreditation of knowledge of Spanish language.</p>
<p><b>Contemporary Technological and Performance Art</b></p>	<p>Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.</p> <p>For students coming from degrees unrelated to contemporary creation, complementary training may be required.</p> <p>Written and graphic report: on motivations and interests to pursue these studies. It is necessary to obtain a minimum rating of 25 points between the written report and the graphic file to be admitted to the master's degree.</p> <p>Specifications:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Written report in pdf format and with a maximum length of 600 words: which reports the academic and/or professional background that motivated the choice of the master's degree, expectations about it and future objectives.</li> <li>- Graphic report or portfolio with a maximum size of 10 MB: the adaptation of the creations shown to contemporary artistic proposals of technological and performative art and the relevance of the contributions will be valued.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Control Engineering, Automation and Robotics</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of C1 in Spanish, by means of a certificate or by means that the Academic Commission considers appropriate, except for graduates of Spanish degrees in the Spanish University System or from a Spanish-speaking country.</p> <p>Clarification of admission criteria regarding accredited Spanish language proficiency (C1):</p>

<b>Control in Smartgrids and Distributed Generation</b>	Accreditation of level B2 English for non-native speakers through official certificates or other merits that the academic committee considers sufficient to certify this level.
<b>Development and International Cooperation</b>	Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.
<b>Economics: Empirical Applications and Policies</b>	<p>For students with certain access degrees, complementary training may be required.</p> <p>Accreditation of the B2 level of English for non-native speakers. Those whose mother tongue is English or who have completed their university studies entirely in English are exempt from this requirement.</p>
<b>Environmental Agrobiology</b>	Accreditation of a B2 level of Spanish is required, which can be demonstrated by an official certificate or other means deemed appropriate by the Academic Committee. This requirement does not apply to individuals who have completed undergraduate studies taught in Spanish within the Spanish university system or to people from Spanish-speaking countries.
<b>Environmental Contamination and Toxicology</b>	Accreditation of level B2 in English by certificate or testing English at the centre.

<p><b>Environmental Engineering and Management</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of level B2 in Spanish, by means of a certificate or by means that the Academic Commission considers appropriate, except for graduates of Spanish degrees in the Spanish University System or from a Spanish-speaking country.</p> <p>For students with certain access degrees, complementary training may be required if they do not prove having previously studied the following subjects: Chemistry, Ecology and Microbiology, Engineering and Construction Projects and Facilities, except for students graduated in Environmental Engineering. Training supplements shall be carried out, in general, prior to the completion of the master's degree or during the first four months of the master's degree. <p><b>Erasmus Mundus International Master of Science in Marine Biological Resources (IMBRSea)</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of level B2 in English or having completed and approved in English at least one year of prior studies in higher education.</p>
<p><b>Erasmus Mundus Master in Architectural and Urban Contemporary Heritage – ARURCOHE</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of level B2 in English for non-native speakers.</p>

<b>Erasmus Mundus Master in Renewable Energy in the Marine Environment (REM PLUS2)</b>	Accreditation of level B2 in English for non-native speakers.
<b>Erasmus Mundus Master of Science in Environmental Contamination and Toxicology (ECT+ONE HEALTH)</b>	Accreditation of level C1 in English for non-native speakers.
<b>Erasmus Mundus Master of Science in Marine Environment and Resources (MER)</b>	Accreditation of level B2 in English for non-native speakers.
<b>Feminist and Gender Studies</b>	Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.
<b>Finance and Financial Management</b>	Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.
<b>Food Quality and Safety</b>	All foreign students from countries where Spanish is not the official language must provide proof that they have achieved a B2 level of Spanish proficiency, or that they have completed a university degree taught in Spanish.
<b>Fundamental Human Rights and Public Authorities</b>	<p>Students must demonstrate language proficiency in Spanish equivalent to level B2, accredited by official certification from the Instituto Cervantes, or be a national of a country whose official or co-official language is Spanish.</p> <p>Notwithstanding the above, in order to verify the aforementioned language level, the Academic Committee of the Master's Degree may invite students to an interview, either in person or by videoconference. To this end, those invited will be sent an email specifying the place, date and time of the interview or, where applicable, the link required to connect via videoconference.</p>

<p><b>Globalization and Development</b></p>	<p>Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.</p>
<p><b>Governance and Policy Studies</b></p>	<p>Knowledge of at least a B2 level or equivalent in Spanish on presentation of the corresponding official qualification or, failing that, by any other means deemed appropriate by the Master's Academic Committee. Excluded from this procedure are graduates of an undergraduate degree taught in the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree or those from a Spanish-speaking country.</p>
<p><b>Healthy Aging and Quality of Life</b></p>	<p>For students with certain access degrees (mainly those with degrees in the social sciences), complementary training may be required.</p>
<p><b>Human Resource and Employment Management</b></p>	<p>In order to be admitted to the programme, students must have at least a C1 level or equivalent in Spanish, as demonstrated by the presentation of the corresponding official certificate. In any case, the academic committee reserves the right to verify whether this level is sufficient through an interview or other means it deems appropriate. Graduates of a degree programme taught in Spanish within the Spanish University System that gives access to this master's degree, or those from a country where Spanish is the official language, will be exempt from this requirement.</p> <p>Foreign persons (including those from EU States) who have been included in the provisional list of admitted persons, may be interviewed (via internet, telephone...) to verify that the level of Spanish is appropriate for carrying out these studies.</p>
<p><b>Industrial Engineering</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of level B2 in the language in which they wish to receive the teaching (Spanish or Basque) by means of a certificate or by any other means that the Academic Committee considers appropriate, except for graduates of degrees taught in Spanish in the Spanish University System or from a Spanish-speaking country.</p> <p>For students with certain access, complementary training may be required, which they must attend before they are enrolled in any subject of the master's degree.</p> <p>Clarification of admission criteria regarding accredited Spanish language level (B2):</p>

<p><b>Industrial Engineering Organization</b></p>	<p>Students coming from countries where Spanish is not the official language or who have not completed an entire degree in this language must certify at least a B2 level of Spanish according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.</p> <p>Additionally to the certification established in the previous paragraph, the Academic Committee of the master's program may conduct a personal interview to verify Spanish language proficiency at the B2 level for students coming from countries where Spanish is not the official language or who have not completed an entire degree in this language.</p>
<p><b>Innovative Enology</b></p>	<p>For students with certain access degrees, complementary training may be required.</p>
<p><b>Integration of Renewable Energy Sources into the Electricity Grid</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of level B2 in Spanish, by means of a certificate or by means that the Academic Commission considers appropriate, except for graduates of Spanish degrees in the Spanish University System or from a Spanish-speaking country.</p> <p>Clarification of admission criteria regarding accredited Spanish language level (B2):</p> <p>–Only accreditations issued by the Instituto Cervantes and its associated centres (DELE or SIELE containing a verification code or accreditations from recognised centres, provided they contain a reference to the successful completion of the four language skills) will be valid, as well as those issued by ACLES Associated Centres (<a href="https://acles.es/es/centros-asociados">https://acles.es/es/centros-asociados</a>) and specific tables for recognised Spanish levels</p>

<p><b>Language Acquisition in Multilingual Settings</b></p>	<p>Provide proof of B2 level proficiency in English certified by internationally recognised agencies. The Commission may conduct a personal interview to assess language proficiency. Persons whose mother tongue is English or who have completed an undergraduate or postgraduate degree in an English-speaking country are exempt from this requirement.</p>

<p><b>Mathematical Modelling, in Mathematical Research and in Statistical and Computing Sciences</b></p>	<p>Accreditation of a B2 level of Spanish is required, which can be demonstrated by an official certificate or other means deemed appropriate by the Academic Committee. This requirement does not apply to individuals who have completed undergraduate studies taught in Spanish within the Spanish university system or to people from Spanish-speaking countries.</p>
<p><b>Mechanical Engineering</b></p>	<p>In addition to the general requirements, and because the master's program is taught in Spanish, those interested must demonstrate a level of Spanish equivalent to B2 by presenting the corresponding official certificate, or failing that, through any other means deemed appropriate by the Academic Committee.
