Level/Courses/Programs offered (per agreement)	<p>Undergraduate and Graduate – FIU offers both Undergraduate (courses numbered 1000-4000 level) and Graduate courses (courses numbered 5000 or above).</p> <p><i>The terms of our specific agreement, as well as balance and availability, determine whether we can accept Undergraduate, Graduate, or both types of students from your institution.</i></p> <p>Please note that courses and programs in the College of Medicine and the College of Law are excluded from all exchange agreements. Courses in the graduate programs are limited.</p>
Course Load per semester	<p>Undergrad: 12 credits minimum, 15 credits maximum (4-5 classes)</p> <p>Graduate: 9 credits minimum, 12 credits maximum (3-4 classes)</p>
Credit System	FIU uses the Carnegie Unit system. In this system, most standard courses are 3 credit hours each.

Even then, graduate business exchange places are part of professional programs and only available on a case-by-case basis. • Graduate Engineering & Mass Communication Courses • Capstone courses: These are reserved for graduating degree-seeking FIU students. • Courses offered at “Virtual Undergraduate Campus”
Course Selection Procedure	<p>Students submit course schedule request & proof of prerequisite completion, if applicable, to OEA. Once pre-requisite reviews are complete, OEA registers exchange students for courses. Proof of prerequisite completion is especially important for courses in certain departments (Business, Communications, Sciences, Computer Sciences/Information Technology, Social Work, Engineering, Education etc.).</p>

Visa	<p>All non-US citizens need a visa to study at FIU as an exchange student. OEA will mail the student an acceptance letter and a DS-2019 form needed to apply for a J-1 exchange visa once the student is admitted to FIU. Students are responsible for applying for their own visas through the U.S. Department of State.</p>
